In 2011, 40 years will have past from the first colloquium. This year's colloquium should reflect what was accomplished at the Uherský Brod meetings while focusing on one of the problems that has been mentioned before, but never fully examined. By virtue of his writings and public exposure, Comenius had a strong political involvement. His actions grew from personal experience as well as philosophical ideals of the day, which he tried to cultivate and attain in his work. The colloquium thus intends to present within its scope a survey of political concepts in the 16th and 17th centuries and attempt to place Comenius more precisely within the development of political thought.
